The Brave Little Tailor

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP – Washington Township's Town Hall Theatre presents the Landmark Children's Theatre Company production of ***The Brave Little Tailor*** **October 31 – November 16, 2008** at Town Hall Theatre. This original adaptation from the Omaha Theatre for Young People will be presented on **Fridays at 7:30pm** and on **Saturdays and Sundays at 3pm**. *There will be no Saturday evening performances of this offering.*

Town Hall Theatre is located at 27 N Main Street in the heart of Centerville. **Ticket prices are \$15 Adults, \$13 Seniors & Students and \$10 for Children (12 & Under)**. The production lasts approximately one hour and is recommended for children ages 4 and up.

The village tailor is bullied by his boss, smothered by his mother and harassed by customers. After he absent-mindedly kills seven flies in one blow, rumors buzz until the king hears of a tailor who can kill seven giants in one blow! Forced to confront his destiny, the tailor must find the courage to live up to his "reputation."

The cast features 11 youth performers between grades 2-12 and eight adults from surrounding communities. In the title role is Casey Blunt, a Kettering Middle School student who appears in his second show this season, having previously performed in *How to Eat Like a Child*. Playing his nemesis, a vain and hopeless incompetent king, is Stephen Michael McVey, who resides in Oxford, Ohio. Mr. McVey has previously been seen as the title role in *The Canterville Ghost*, Ram Dass in *A Little Princess* and, most recently, as *Frog* in *A Year with Frog and Toad*. John Lavarney, who designs props at Wright State University and Tristan Cupp, who works in the scene shop at the Human Race Theatre Company bring hilarity to their roles as two very dim-witted giants.

The Brave Little Tailor is directed by John Lockwood, who last directed *Where the Red Fern Grows* for Town Hall Theatre and works locally as a theatre artist with the Human Race, Muse Machine and Wright State University. The production features a set design by Michelle Leigh, with costumes by Briley Lambert, sound by Bruce Bowes and lighting by Robyn Joyce. Anita Jackson will stage manage the show.
